Service Impact

Collegiate OPA sisters collectively recorded 18,756 hours of service in 2020, even in the midst of the Covid-19 pandemic.

In a typical academic year, our collegiate members collectively log more than 50,000 service hours. If valued at \$15/hour, that is an impact of \$750,000 across the communities we serve during a typical year.
