



## Constitutional Revisions from the NEB

1. **Throughout:** National Executive Board refers to the strategic leadership board.

**Change:** Update any reference to the National Executive Board to Board of Directors.

**Rationale:** This change is requested to accurately reflect and correct confusion about the strategic operations of the Board. This also mirrors the naming convention of the Board of Directors that will be implemented for our 501(c)3 Foundation to create a common structure between the Foundation and Sorority leadership.

2. **Article III, Section 1:**

### Article III National Policies

#### Section 1. Alcohol and Illegal Drug Policy

- Clause 1. Omega Phi Alpha complies with all federal, state, local, and university laws and regulations regarding the use, possession, and distribution of alcohol and illegal drugs.
- Clause 2. There shall be no use, possession, or distribution of alcohol or illegal drugs of any kind at an OPA Event. OPA members and invited guests may not attend an OPA Event if they are under the influence of alcohol or illegal drugs.
  - A. An OPA Event is defined as an event, project, meeting, or gathering that has been officially coordinated, sponsored, or promoted by a chapter, an active, alumna, pledge, or colonist as a part of sorority activities.
  - B. An OPA Event is also defined as any outing, meeting, or gathering that is discussed or planned 1) at another OPA project, meeting, or gathering or 2) through official means of sorority communication, including but not limited to sorority email, email lists, or social media groups.
  - C. When an OPA Event ends, or an individual active, alumna, pledge, or colonist leaves the Event with the intent of not returning, attendees are subject to federal, state, local, and university laws and regulations.

#### Change to read:

### Article III National Policies

#### Section 2. Alcohol and Illegal Drug Policy

- Clause 1. Omega Phi Alpha complies with all federal, state, local, and university laws and regulations regarding the use, possession, and distribution of alcohol and illegal drugs.
- Clause 2. There shall be no use, possession, or distribution of alcohol or illegal drugs of any kind at an OPA *Pledge or Active* Event. OPA members and invited guests may not attend an OPA *Pledge or Active* Event if they are under the influence of alcohol or illegal drugs.
  - A. An OPA *Pledge or Active* Event is defined as an event, project, meeting, or gathering that has been officially coordinated, sponsored, or promoted by a chapter, an active, ~~alumna~~, pledge, or colonist as a part of sorority activities.
  - B. An OPA *Pledge or Active* Event is also defined as any outing, meeting, or gathering that is discussed or planned 1) at another OPA *Pledge or Active*



project, meeting, or gathering or 2) through official means of *active chapter sorority* communication, including but not limited to sorority email, email lists, or social media groups.

- C. When an OPA *Pledge or Active Event* ends, or an individual active, alumna, pledge, or colonist leaves the Event with the intent of not returning, attendees are subject to federal, state, local, and university laws and regulations.

**Clause 3.** Alcohol may be consumed at OPA Alumnae Events in accordance with the guidelines published by the national organization.

- A. An OPA Alumnae Event is defined as an event, project, meeting, or gathering that has been coordinated, sponsored, or promoted by the national organization, alumnae chapter, or an alumna as a part of sorority activities.
- B. An OPA Alumnae Event is eligible for attendees to consume alcohol only if no OPA active member is in attendance, regardless of the active member's age.
- C. OPA funds may not be used for the purchase of alcohol under any circumstances.
- D. Alcohol at an OPA Alumnae Event must be served by a licensed, third-party vendor.
- E. When an OPA Alumnae Event ends, or an individual active, alumna, pledge, or colonist leaves the Event with the intent of not returning, attendees are subject to federal, state, local, and university laws and regulations.
- F. Alumnae member are prohibited to attend any OPA Pledge or Active Event following the consumption of alcohol per Clause 2.

**Clause 4.** There shall be no use, possession, or distribution of illegal drugs at any kind of OPA Alumnae Events.

## Constitutional Revisions from the Collegiate Membership Team

1. **Throughout:** Rushee refers to members seeking members in Omega Phi Alpha.

**Change:** Update any reference to rushee to Potential New Member

**Rationale:** Best practices in higher education discourage the use of certain recruitment vernacular for Greek letter and other organization. This includes the term "rushee." The Collegiate Membership Team feels it is important to make these updates before this is required by an affiliated university.

Additionally, chapters have started to use updated vocabulary to reflect the same change. We respect the experience and work of our chapters and would like to reflect that in our national processes while bringing all chapters together to use a common national recruitment vocabulary.

2. **Throughout:** Pledge refers to members seeking membership in Omega Phi Alpha.

**Change:** Update any reference to pledge to new member.

This includes the term “pledge period.” The Collegiate Membership Team feels it is important to make these updates before this is required by an affiliated university.

Additionally, chapters have started to use updated vocabulary to reflect the same change. We respect the experience and work of our chapters and would like to reflect that in our national processes while bringing all chapters together to use a common national recruitment vocabulary.

4. **Throughout:** Rush refers to the process of recruitment members in Omega Phi Alpha.

**Change:** Update any reference of rush to recruitment.

**Rationale:** Best practices in higher education discourage the use of certain recruitment vernacular for Greek letter and other organization. This includes the term “rush.” The Collegiate Membership Team feels it is important to make these updates before this is required by an affiliated university.

Additionally, chapters have started to use updated vocabulary to reflect the same change. We respect the experience and work of our chapters and would like to reflect that in our national processes while bringing all chapters together to use a common national recruitment vocabulary.

5. **Throughout:** Pledge education refers to the process of educating members in Omega Phi Alpha.

**Change:** Update any reference to pledge education to new member education.

7. **Throughout:** Pledgeship refers to the process in which a chapter conducts to activate members in Omega Phi Alpha.

**Change:** Update any reference to pledgeship to new membership.

This includes the term “pledgeship.” The Collegiate Membership Team feels it is important to make these updates before this is required by an affiliated university. Additionally, chapters have started to use updated vocabulary to reflect the same change. We respect the experience and work of our chapters and would like to reflect that in our national processes while bringing all chapters together to use a common national recruitment vocabulary.

## Constitutional Revisions from the Legislation Committee

### Article IV, Section 7, Clause 1 revise to read (remove parts strikethrough):

- A. At the written request of the member ~~via~~ using the Voluntary Disassociation Form. ~~(available in the national handbook)~~

### Article IV, Section 7, Clause 3 revise to read (remove parts strikethrough):

All disassociations for reasons in clause 1 and 2 must follow the national disassociations procedures. ~~in the national handbook~~

### Article IV, Section 10, Clause 1.

Currently reads:

If a chapter deems it necessary to conduct selective recruitment, they must receive prior written approval from the Vice President of Membership and comply with procedures outlined in the National Handbook.

### Change first sentence to read:

~~If a chapter deems it necessary to conduct selective recruitment, they must receive prior written approval from the Collegiate Membership Director and comply with the selective recruitment guidelines that will be provided in procedures.~~

### Article V:

~~Section 3. District Officers. District officers shall consist of:~~

~~Clause 1. Traveling Leadership Consultants — elected by the District Summit Delegation of the District Summit they wish to serve; and~~

~~Clause 2. Active District Officers — elected by the active sisters of each district annually in the manner upon which they have agreed.~~

~~Section 4. Regional Officers. Regional officers shall consist of directors of alumnae activities — appointed in compliance with procedures in the national handbook to serve a one-year term.~~

Section 5. All national, ~~district~~, and appointed officers must be members in good standing of Omega Phi Alpha.

~~Section 6. All members of the Board of Alumnae Affairs and traveling leadership consultants must be alumna members of Omega Phi Alpha.~~

**Delete Sections 3, 4, and 6, then renumber accordingly.**

New Section 3 (Old Section 5), *strike the word “district,”*



## Article VI, Section 2

Section 2. Members of the National Executive Board will be elected at the national convention.

- Clause 1. Vice President positions shall serve two-year terms and be elected every two years beginning in 2015 with the exception of the offices up for election in 2014 and those ending in 2017.
- A. 2014: Vice President of Communications, Vice President of Chapter Support (ending in 2017), Vice President of Expansions (ending in 2017), and Vice President of Administration (ending in 2017).
  - B. 2015: Vice President of Business Operations (ending in 2017), and Vice President of Membership (ending in 2017).
  - C. 2016: President, Vice President of Programs, Vice President of Lifetime Membership, Vice President of Communications and Vice President of Finance.
- Clause 2. A written election schedule shall be placed in the national handbook for further clarification.

### Revise to read:

Section 2. Election of Board of Directors and Operational Leadership Team.

- Clause 1. Members of the Board of Directors will be elected at the biennial national conventions held in the odd-numbered years.
- Clause 2. Members of the Operational Leadership Team that are elected are the Chapter Support Director, the Cardinal Principles Director, the Alumnae Membership Director, the Collegiate Membership Director, and the Expansions Director. The slate for these officers will be presented at even-year District Summits. The officers will be elected according to the Summit Election Procedure for two-year terms.
- Clause 3. All remaining Operational Leadership Team members will be appointed in even years for two-year terms.

## Article VI, Section 3,

Section 3. A member of the National Executive Board may not be elected to the same office for more than two consecutive full terms.

### Revise to read:

A member of the Board of Directors or the Operational Leadership Team may not be elected or appointed to the same office for more than two consecutive full terms.

## Article VI, Section 4, Clause 1:

- Clause 1. The National President with the recommendations of the National Executive Board shall fill vacancies on the National Executive Board and/or National Board with the exceptions of local president. Any person appointed to elected offices shall serve until the next national convention, at which time a replacement shall be elected to fill the remainder of the unexpired term.

Change “National Board with the exception of local president.” to “Operational Leadership Team.”

Change “national convention” to “scheduled election.”



**Article VI, Section 4, Clause 2:**

Clause 2. In the case of a vacancy of the national president, the president-elect shall become president. In the case where there is no president-elect, the next officer in succession as per the order stated in Article V, Section 1 of the constitution should assume the position of interim president until the National Executive Board can elect a new president to serve until the next national convention, at which time a replacement shall be elected by the delegation to fill the remainder of the unexpired term.

**Amend to read:**

In the case of a vacancy of the National President, the next officer in succession as per the order stated in Article V, Section 1 shall become interim president until the Board of Directors can elect a new president to serve until the next national convention, at which time a replacement shall be elected by the delegation to fill the remainder of the unexpired term.

**Article X, Section 4**

Section 4. Special meetings may be called by the National President or by petition of five or more members of the National Executive Board.

Proposed change: Change five to three

**Article X, Section 5 AND Article X, Section 7**

Section 5. All meetings of the National Executive Board or the National Board shall be considered open to any lifetime member of the national organization unless otherwise specified by the National Executive Board.

Section 7. The National Board shall meet at the call of the National President.

Proposed change: Change National Board to Operational Leadership Team

**Article XIII, Section 1, Clause 1.**

Clause 1. The Vice President of Chapter Support, in cooperation with the Traveling Leadership Consultant for and a representative from said chapter, will establish written guidelines for the chapter to follow for one year.

**Amend to read:**

The Chapter Support Director, in cooperation with the Chapter Success Coordinator and a representative from the chapter, will establish written guidelines for the chapter to follow for one year.

**Article XIII, Section 3.**

Section 3. An active chapter whose membership drops below ten active members must notify the Vice President of Membership, who must then take action to help the chapter with membership problems.

Strike section and renumber following sections.



#### **Article XIV**

- Section 1. The sorority shall be divided into districts using the procedures described in the national handbook. A list of all the chapters in each district shall be placed in the national handbook.
- Clause 1. Each district shall have at least one traveling leadership consultant.
  - Clause 2. A district shall consist of no less than two chapters.
  - Clause 3. Each district shall have a number of Active District Officers equal to or greater than the number of active chapters in that district.
  - Clause 4. Active chapter distribution will be evaluated at least once every ten years using the procedures in the national handbook to ensure proper arrangement of chapters into districts.

#### **Revise to read:**

The sorority shall be divided into districts using the national procedure.

- A. Each district shall have a yearly District Summit
- B. A district shall consist of no less than two chapters
- C. Each district shall have Active District Officers from each chapter in that district.
- D. Active chapter distribution will be re-evaluated at least once every ten years using the national procedure.

#### **Article XV**

- Section 2. The sorority shall be divided into regions using the procedures described in the national handbook. An actual map depicting the region boundaries shall be placed in the national handbook.
- Clause 1. Each region shall have at least one director of alumnae activities. The number appointed will be determined based on procedures in the national handbook.
  - Clause 2. Alumnae membership will be evaluated at least once every ten years using the procedures in the national handbook to ensure proper representation of all alumnae members.

#### **Revise to read:**

The sorority shall be divided into regions using the national procedure.

- A. Each region shall have at least one Director of Alumnae Activities to be appointed by the national procedure.
- B. Alumnae membership will be re-evaluated at least once every ten years using the national procedure to ensure proper representation.



## Bylaws Revisions from the NEB

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**Change:** Update any reference to the National Executive Board to Board of Directors.

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## Constitutional Revisions by Acclamation

These are strictly name changes that are already in place by procedures and being used that need to be reflected in the constitution.

### Article V, Revise to read:

**Section 1.** Board of Directors. The Board of Directors shall consist of the following members: National President, Vice President of Programs, Vice President of Communication, Vice President of Lifetime Membership, and Vice President of Finance.

**Section 2.** Operational Leadership Team. The Operational Leadership Team shall consist of the following members: Chapter Operations Director, Cardinal Principles Director, Alumnae Membership Director, Expansions Director, Collegiate Membership Director, and other directors as appointed.

### Article VII, Section 4

Replace Vice President of Alumnae Relations with Alumnae Membership Director

### Article XIII, Section 2, Clause 2, Sub-Clause 2.

Replace "Travelling Leadership Consultant" with "Chapter Success Coordinator"

### Article XIII, Section 11.

Replace "Vice President of Alumnae Relations" with "Alumnae Membership Director"

### Article XVIII, Section 1

Replace "Vice President of Administration" with "Director of Administration"





## Constitutional Revisions from the National Standards Board

### Article IV, Section 1: add

- Clause 1.** Charters apply only to the campus of the school that was originally colonized and may not be extended to satellite campuses. Students must be enrolled in at campus location where the charter was granted to pledge.
- Clause 2.** Actives with dual enrollment at multiple campuses (included at a chartered campus) can choose to remain active during semesters enrolled exclusively at an affiliate campus if they can fulfill all chapter requirements for active members. For a semester during which the member has requirements at both campuses, the member can remain active or be allowed an automatic LOA.

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## Bylaws Revisions from the Legislation Committee

### Article IV

Section 1. Duties of all officers: It shall be the duty of all elected and appointed officers of Omega Phi Alpha to perform all duties as described in the national handbook to the best of their abilities, and to obey and uphold the constitution and principles of Omega Phi Alpha. Terms of office for all national officers will begin at the conclusion of the national convention at which they are elected, or upon appointment. All officers may serve in more than one role concurrently; however the National President and the Vice President of Finance may not be the same person.

#### Revise to read:

Section 1. Duties of all officers: It shall be the duty of all elected and appointed officers of Omega Phi Alpha to perform all duties, as described in their position descriptions in the Member Resource Center, to the best of their abilities, and to obey and uphold the constitution and principles of Omega Phi Alpha.

Section 2. Officer transition:

Clause 1. Officers Elected at Convention will take office at the conclusion of the convention at which they are elected

Clause 2. Officers appointed take office upon appointment

Clause 3. Officers Elected in District Summits take office by July 1 following the District Summit cycle in which they were elected

Section 3. Board of Directors may not serve in more than one Board of Director role concurrently, but other officers of the National Team may serve in more than one role concurrently.

### Article V

Section 1. The President's Council shall consist of the National President, President-Elect, and all chapter presidents. They shall seek to provide open channels of communication and understanding. It is the duty of all council members to respond promptly to communications received, to remain objective, to provide constructive criticism, to attend or send a representative to convention or any special meetings, to keep national's objectives and goals in mind, and to represent their members as a whole while serving as members of this council.

Section 2. The Service Council shall be chaired by the National Service Director or Vice President of Programs, in the instance where a Service Director has not been appointed or is unavailable, and include at least one service director from each chapter. Its duties shall include assisting all local service officers in the coordinating of projects and providing ideas for service projects. It is the duty of all council members to respond promptly to communications received, to remain objective, to provide constructive criticism, to attend or send a representative to convention or any other special meetings, to keep national objectives and goals in mind, and to represent their chapter while serving as members of the council.

Section 3. The Constitutional Revisions Committee shall be chaired by a sister appointed by the Vice President of Administration. This officer shall be named before December 1 to serve from that time until the end of the next national convention. The committee shall consist of the chair and members of the National Board. This committee shall review all amendments and forward them to the national convention. It shall have the power to screen duplicate amendments before presentation and shall inform the convention of said screening.



- Section 4. The Nominating Committee shall be chaired by the Vice President of Administration and be comprised of former National Executive Board officers. This committee shall meet before elections of officers at each convention and review all petitions. They shall recommend a slate of candidates consisting of no more than two or three for each office.
- Section 5. The Budget Committee shall consist of the National Executive Board and be chaired by the Vice President of Finance. It shall be the duty of the committee to propose an annual operating budget for the approval of the convention delegation.
- Section 6. The Alumnae Liaison Council shall be chaired by the Vice President of Alumnae Relations and consist of the alumnae liaison of each chapter and the president of each alumnae chapter. Members shall serve as a liaison between the alumnae and the local chapters. They shall assist with chapter growth, maintain alumnae rosters according to the national handbook, and work together to establish relationships between alumnae and active sisters.
- Section 7. The Membership Council shall be chaired by the Vice President of Membership and be composed of a pledge educator from each chapter. Its purpose shall be to assist the Vice President of Chapter Support in keeping active membership to ten or higher and to assist in maintaining membership and pledging guidelines.
- Section 8. The Chapter Assistance Committee shall be chaired by the Vice President of Chapter Support and shall consist of all Traveling Leadership Consultants, all Chapter Alumnae Advisors, and any other persons appointed by the Vice President of Chapter Support. The committee chairperson may call upon any active to serve on the committee as deemed necessary. The committee's purpose shall be to assist chapters exhibiting distress signals before they reach the point of conditional status and to assist chapters that are on conditional status.
- Section 9. The Leadership Development (LEAD) team shall be chaired by the National Leadership Program Director and consist of alumnae and actives appointed by the chair and Vice President of Programs. These members will serve as coordinators and facilitators of the National Leadership Program. The team will organize, develop, coordinate and distribute all materials relating to the National Leadership Program.
- Section 10. The Financial Review Committee shall be chaired by the Vice President of Business Operations and consist of two other national executive board members. Other members may be appointed at the discretion of the National President. Each year, after the books are closed, they will review the sorority's financial records. This review will include (but not be limited to): Confirmation of all assets held by the sorority, review of financial statements, review of sample of transactions, and review of Tax Return
- Section 11. The National Standards Board shall be appointed by the Vice President of Membership. It shall be the duty of this committee to ensure that the standards of Omega Phi Alpha are being upheld by all members, in the fashion that Chapter Standards Boards do. National Standards Board members shall be responsible for making decisions on the national level regarding disassociations and statuses of members, and providing training materials to Chapters Standards Boards.

Section 3: Change National Board to National Team.

Section 4: Change National Executive Board officers to National officers.

Section 6: Change national handbook to national procedure.

Section 11: Change first sentence to read:  
The National Standards Board shall be appointed by the Vice President of Lifetime Membership and shall consist of a National Standards Board Chair, who is on the Board of Directors, and National Standards Board members that will be defined in procedures on the Member Resource Center.

### Article VII, Section 3.

Section 3. All active chapters shall complete a service project report form to be submitted to the National Office twice each year, ~~December 15 and June 1~~. This form shall contain the total number of chapter project hours as well as the project hours for each sister.

Remove the two dates.

### Article VIII, Section 2, Clause 5

Clause 5. The local membership director shall be responsible for recruiting, training and activating pledge members. She shall forward the permanent home addresses to the appropriate national officer. She shall submit a copy of the local pledging rules to the Vice President of Membership at the end of each academic year for review. She must submit copies of the original national test answer sheets, the pledge summary form and the pledge roster to the Vice President of Membership two weeks prior to the activation ceremony. She must report the activities of the pledge class to the active chapter at each meeting. She cannot activate the eligible pledges until she receives written confirmation from the Vice President of Membership.

Delete "Vice President of Membership" in the first occurrence and change to "National Office"

### Article X

Section 1. The national organization's fiscal year shall be July 1 through June 30. The annual operating budget must be a balanced budget in compliance with guidelines set forth in the national/district officer's manual. The annual operating budget is approved by a majority vote of the delegates at the national convention. Amendments to the annual operating budget to change the total expenditure/uses must be approved by a 2/3 vote of all active chapters and the alumnae delegates present and voting at the previous convention. Amendments to the annual budget to move money between line items without changing the total budget must be approved by a 2/3 vote of the National Executive Board.

Section 2. The national organization may grant non-interest bearing loans to chapters using the guidelines set forth in the national handbook.

Section 3. The national organization shall require competitive bids for all purchases paid from the national treasury greater than one thousand dollars in compliance with purchasing procedures set forth in the National Handbook.



- Section 4. Reimbursement for authorized sorority travel will be made in compliance with the travel procedures in the national handbook.
- Section 5. In cases of extreme financial hardship, national active dues, pledge fees, activation fees, and colonization fees may be waived by the national organization in compliance with guidelines set forth in the national handbook.

- Section 1: Change “national/district officer’s manual” to “national procedures.”
- Section 2: Strike this section and renumber accordingly.
- Section 3: Delete “National Handbook” and Add “national procedure.”

**Article XI, Section 1**

- Section 1. A permanent set of records shall be stored at the national records office.
- Clause 1. These records shall include the most current copies of the National Executive Board Manual and the National Handbook.

**Amend to read:**

- Section 1. A permanent set of records shall be stored on the digital files.
- Clause 1 These records shall include the most current copies of the national policies and procedures, and the national constitution and by laws.

### **Article IX, Section 2**
